If the player is uncertain about the right procedure in a match, the player is **not** allowed to play out the hole with two balls

#### 3.2c. Applying Handicaps in Handicap Match

- (1) **Declaring Handicaps**. The player and *opponent* should tell each other their handicaps before the match. If a player declares a wrong handicap either before or during the match and does not correct the mistake before the *opponent* makes their next *stroke*:
- <u>Declared Handicap Too High</u>. The player is **disqualified** if this affects the number of strokes the player gives or gets. If it does not, there is no penalty.
- <u>Declared Handicap Too Low</u>. There is no penalty and the player must use the declared lower handicap to calculate the number of strokes the player gives or gets.

#### **SCORECARD**

It is mandatory for the physical scorecard to be submitted to the starter, attested by both players, immediately after the match.

- Attempt to make the best score possible at each hole.
- If a hole is conceded, the player's score for the hole will be the number of strokes already taken plus the number of strokes that the player will most likely take to complete the hole. For example, if a player is lying on the green 4 feet from the hole, add 1 stroke; if it is more than 10 feet, then add 2 strokes.
- Certify the scores of both players, regardless of the outcome of the match.

### KGA Golfer of the year 2024-25

KGA will recognize 'Golfer of the Year' based on performance across several tournaments in a year. The recognition will be separately for Open, Men, Women & Seniors (60+ years).

Playing and teaching professionals as well as players who figure in any IGU Order of Merit list are not eligible.

Points will be assigned to players who finish in the top 20 positions of the following selected tournaments:

- 1. The Independence Day Trophy
- 2. The John D'Souza (Senior) Memorial
- 3. The Republic Day Cup
- 4. The Founder's Trophy
- 5. Captain's Tankard
- 6. President's Medal
- 7. Karnataka Rajyotsava

- 8. KGA Senior's tournament
- 9. Singles Open/Handicap Matchplay (top 16 players)

#### Points System:

- For Tournaments 1 to 8: 20pts for 1st position down to 1pt to 20th position
- For Matchplay: Winner-20, Runner-18, SF-15, QF-10, PreQF-5 points

All positions will be determined as defined in the terms of competition for that specific tournament.

For the Seniors category of the 60 years and above, all 3 age groups will be combined for the purpose of awarding points.

In case of a tie for the cumulative points at the end of the year, the golfer with the maximum number of wins will be declared the winner. If there is still a tie, the points from the following tournaments will be aggregated to determine the winner.

- 1. The Independence Day Trophy
- 2. The Republic Day Cup
- 3. The Founder's Trophy.

The Leader board will be updated in the KGA app to track the progress through the year.

- Captain of the CCDP will be allowed 2 wildcard entries outside the list of probable's
- Captain of KGA will have to authorise the selected team.
